Over 3,000 prints bear her magic touch, and since 1989 the quilting world has been flooded with millions of yards of her fabrics to play with. She studied textiles/surface design at Fashion Institute of Technology in New York City and University of Vermont. Laura Ashley in Wales (U.K.), her first exposure into the textile industry, is where she got her feet wet as a designer. Then, she was Creative Director for P&B Textiles in San Francisco before opening Studio Sampou in 1996, where she has created thousands of best-selling fabrics

for Robert Kaufman. A natural-born traveler, Jennifer has wandered this planet in search of wonderful treasures, and has found beauty and inspiration from the markets of Kathmandu or Zanzibar, to her own

backyard. Her passion is to design fabrics that inspire people to create things to make

your home uniquely you. She is creating fresh quilt patterns now for C&T Publishing, and also co-authored with her sister "In the Nursery", a treatise of ways and means to build a safe, loving environment for your

little ones using a favorite theme as a basis. Jennifer will happily bring her own secret stash for sale to our meeting, which is a rare treat for guilds—but because she is a local, we are special!!

Proposed Change to Bylaws

After much deliberation, the Board has approved the following change to the Bylaws to be considered and voted on by the Guild membership at our November meeting. The main goal of this change is to reduce the number of membership categories from four to two, eliminating both the Senior and Student memberships. This would leave Regular and Junior (under 18) as the only membership categories and as of January 1, 2015 all active adult memberships would be at the same membership dues of \$35.00. Senior members who have already renewed their 2014–15 memberships would not see any impact from this change until renewal in October 2015. No changes to the Newsletter Only or Affiliate categories. Some reasons for this proposed change:

- Mainly, there has been a steady decline in the number of Regular members in the Guild to the point that there are now far more Senior members than Regular members.
 This has led to decreased income from dues, which was not the intent of Senior membership.
- All adult members benefit equally from membership thus should pay equally.
- While we all work hard to keep expenses down, some expenses, like speaker fees, have increased dramatically over the last few years.
- Research of other guilds in our area shows that they have also simplified their membership categories.
- The last increase in dues, \$5.00, was made in 2006.

Never dread a messy working space if you learn to construct an origami-style two-inch high pop-up collapsible travel box in needlepoint stitches to hold your orts, a German word for scraps and generally now meaning the leftover snipped threads from ongoing projects. SF EGA members Pat Furlong and Celia Rifkin have prepared a hands-on introduction to Reversible Blackwork and the Rice Stitch on interlock canvas using

fibers called Overture and Watercolours. Tapestry needles provided as the celebration of the 39th anniversary of the local chapter begins at St. John's UCC. Registration deadline as well for 2015 SF chapter-administered White Iris six-month Group Correspondence Course written for The Embroiderers' Guild of America, Inc., focused on pulled-thread techniques using white threads on linen to form lace-like patterns. On Nov. 18th at 10 A.M., there's a stitched flat Gingerbread House assembly lesson held at Lincoln Park Presbyterian Church, 31st Avenue and Clement. 



Community Outreach: News...

Christmas Stockings for Ft. Miley Veterans

Pick up a Christmas stocking kit and instructions at the outreach table. The second one only takes about an hour from start to finish. The first one takes longer as you decipher my directions. Completed stockings will be filled with toiletries and small gifts and distributed to hospitalized veterans in San Francisco.

Birthing a Quilt

Birthing a quilt is easier than you think! We have lots of donated lap- and crib-size quilt tops that need finishing. Birthing a quilt, also called the pillowcase method, is a way of finishing a quilt without binding. We have easy directions for you to follow, and tops paired with backs and batting for you to finish.

Basically, to birth a quilt you layer the top and back right sides together, add the batting on top and stitch around the perimeter using a quarter-inch seam while leaving an opening for turning. Once the quilt is turned right-side out, you top stitch around the edge and "quilt as desired." Quilting can be simple straight-line quilting or a diagonal grid on the quilt. Or ask about other simple designs.

Save your Hobbs UPC Labels!

Hobbs Quilt Batting Company offers a charity price to guilds for rolls of batting. If we send them five UPC labels (bar codes) from Hobbs packaged batting, they will sell us a 96" by 30-yard roll of batting for our outreach quilts for an incredibly low price—less than half of retail. Turn your UPC labels in to the Community Outreach table at Guild meetings or mail them to Community Outreach (at P.O.

Box 27002, SF CA 94127). You can help stretch our outreach budget and get those lovely donated quilt tops out to those who need them.

Baby Quilts for S.F. General Hospital

San Francisco General Hospital has need of baby quilts (35" x 45") for new mothers. They do not have very many premature infants so cannot use our preemie quilts. Everyone loves making preemie quilts because they are quick and use up small amounts of fabric and batting. But, guess what? Community Outreach has lots of suitable fabric and batting for baby quilts. Pick up a kit at guild meetings or come to the Saturday Sewcial on November 15th and we will have fabric and patterns. Can we make 24 baby quilts before the end of the year?

Since April 2014 we have delivered:

25 pillowcases to UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital

- 12 baby quilts to Homeless Prenatal
- 13 lap quilts to Mt. Zion Hospice
- 10 preemie quilts to Kaiser Neonatal Unit

We presently have

14 tops that are paired with batting but need backs

7 tops that need both backs and batting


- 13 tops with backs that need batting


Block of the Month: November block


