After an education in art and an early career in interior design with her own wallpaper and fabric-design business, Melinda has been involved with quilting and wearable arts since 1996, her first love. She often experiments with new techniques, and her dynamic and modern sense of

color and design has won her numerous awards and her work has been featured in many places, including on the cover of *Better Homes and Garden* magazine, as well as exhibited in amazing venues such as Shelburne Museum in Vermont, Quilt Expo en Beaujolais in France, and the Texas Quilt Museum. She will also be teaching her fabulous fusible-flower technique at our July 25<sup>th</sup> Saturday Sewcial Workshop.

## May Board Meeting Summary

On May 26, 2015, the Board *discussed* . . .

. . . the last meeting/speaker and felt a better balance between innovative and traditional programs would appeal to our membership. This request will be forwarded to the new Program Committee.

. . . Quiltaway chairwomen presented an update on the event. They discussed the registration procedure and their proposal for fairly matching members to their first choice of workshop. They will explain the procedure and timeline to the membership. Making Outreach quilts one of the evenings was discussed and the help Adrienne will need to make kits or provide fabric.

. . . a New Member Social. No date has been set. Additional information is needed regarding the number of new members from 2014, and from 2015. The Board expects to take a greater role in creating this Social.

. . . Opportunity Quilt 2016-17 still needs design ideas and a coordinator. We looked at the picture of a quilt with a Storm at Sea/star design. The Petaluma

Guild's Opportunity Quilt was mentioned as it has many squares instead of bias or curved seams, and interesting color play.

. . . Quilt Show 2017 has the venue reserved for March 24-25<sup>th</sup>.

. . . the quilt frames that we own are valued at \$41 new. We will reserve some for future displays and offer some for sale to other quilt guilds through NCQC and other avenues if necessary. Storage for the ones we keep was discussed and it looks like we have a new storage option when the current one is no longer available.

**New Business:** Gloria proposed a sale at our June 16<sup>th</sup> Guild meeting of the fabric from Debbie Fox Diamond's estate. The sale will begin at 6:30 P.M. Fabric will be prepackaged in one-, two-, and three-yard lengths for \$2 per yard. Ways of getting this information disseminated to our membership was discussed. In addition to the newsletter, an e-mail blast will be sent out.

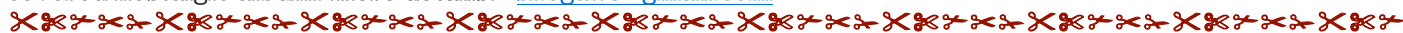

## Block of the Month: Patriotic Stars

*Will be drawn at July 2015 meeting . . .*

You can make any star of your choosing.

Just have a **blue** background and **red**-and-white star, and make it 12 1/2" square.

### Cut

Four 3 1/2" squares from background and four 3 7/8" squares from background.

Four 3 7/8" squares from white

Four 3 7/8" squares from red

Cut all 3 7/8" squares into half-square triangles (HST)

### Sew

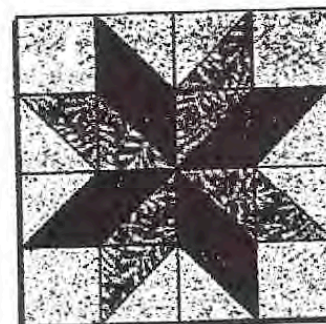
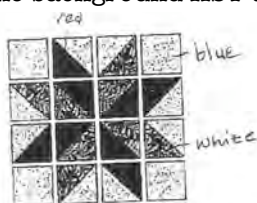
One background HST to a white HST; repeat until you have four.

One background HST to a red HST; repeat until you have four.

One red HST to a white HST; repeat until you have four.

### Arrange

Arrange as shown in diagram.

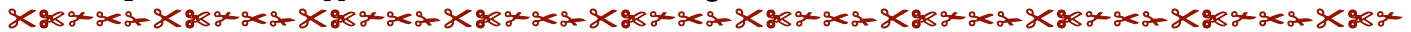
