Remember, there are no refunds for cancellations. For the comfort of all, please attend sewcial "fragrance free." Bring your lunch or check out several places to eat within walking distance. Please pay fees when you sign up in advance for sewcial.

Directions to the Police Academy: Our sewcial are held from 10 A.M. to 4 P.M. at the San Francisco Police Academy, 350 Amber Drive (at Duncan), near Diamond Heights Safeway. Take SF Muni bus #52; or drive your car, parking is free.

At the beginning of the year, Lee and I chose a bed-sized quilt for Momoko. I completed the quilt top by adding an outer border, and provided the backing and binding. I had it professionally quilted. I recently made a trip to Japan and presented the quilt to Momoko, who was so so touched. She said, "I miss my friend very much and I will cherish this quilt forever."

Dorothy's quilt will live on as a requiem to her life passion.

You must also bring a 4 x 6" photograph of your quilt. If you cannot bring a photo, then you *must* bring the quilt to the December meeting to be photographed. You will be required to sign your entry. You will also be required to pay \$10 for each entry with either a credit card or a debit card.

When you arrive at the December meeting, look for the table "Quilt Show Entries Here." This table will be staffed by Caroline Cory and Lee Schulstad. Sign in.

During the meeting, we will call you back to the table to do your entry. We will be filling out the online entry form with your assistance. If you bring your quilt instead of a photo, one of us will take a photo of your quilt. You may enter up to four quilts in the show. Each quilt will require a separate online entry. 
