...A Letter from Our Guild President ...

Twenty years ago in London, as a physics major, I was first introduced to the concept of the “two-body problem”. At the time I only knew of it as a tricky calculation concerning two particles, but after graduation I was introduced to it as a description of two physicists who are in a relationship when one of them is offered a job in a different country. Do the two bodies end their relationship or does one give up their career and move to follow the other? Jane Strem has shown me how inspirational the role of president can be—I can only hope to contribute something approaching the level of leadership and encouragement she has during the last two years. I know you’ll join me in thanking her most sincerely for doing such a wonderful job! This month sees several changes to the Board and I want to thank those coming on, those retiring, and those continuing to serve for all they contribute to the guild. October 18th: Jan Soules. Lecture: “Judge’s Choice: How Your Quilt is Judged”

An accomplished quilter since 2000, and a quilting judge since 2012, Jan Soules will be treating us to the inside scoop about what judges are looking for and how quilts are evaluated. Using her own quilts for examples, Jan will walk us through the judging process step by step. Jan’s personal style is eclectic, a mixture of piecing and appliqué with special attention placed on color and design. Such attention has granted her five Best of Show and six Best Use of Color awards, along with



numerous first place and Judges’ Choice ribbons. She has had her quilts juried into AQS shows in Paducah, Knoxville, Ashville, Des Moines, and Lancaster; and Mancuso shows such as PIQF and Road to California. On the flip side, Jan has graciously accepted our guild’s request to be one of the judges for our upcoming quilt show in March. Jan Soules holds a

treasure trove of knowledge from all sides of a quilter’s life and will share her insights with us. Jan hopes that by the end of this evening, we will gain some insight into making quilts that stand out from all the others and that we’ll all go away a winner!

Meet Your 2017 Guild Board Members

Alex Byrne – President. Alex arrived in San Francisco in February 2015 and soon joined the guild. Having been taught to sew and knit at a very young age, she has been sewing and crafting steadily ever since. Her greatest love is English paper patchwork but she enjoys all styles of piecing and quilting. At the beginning of 2016, Alex offered to help Adrienne with the community-outreach activities of the guild, having taken part in the Autumn Outreach Sewcial a few months earlier. She identified four new patterns and wrote cutting guides for each one. She then helped run the “kit cutting” event where many guild members helped restock Adrienne’s supplies. Prior to this Alex contributed a framed purse-making table to the December guild meeting. Having contributed to the guild through both volunteering her time and through copious library fines she is now honored to be the guild’s new president.

Nelson Salsa—Vice President. Nelson has been quilting for approximately three years and has been a member of the guild for a whopping four months. He is constantly in awe of the endless possibilities of the medium of quilting that he has yet to explore. Nelson enjoys spending time with his boyfriend of six years and his cat Buddy, burning through his cellular data plan, and reminiscing about his days as a classical vocalist.

Gloria Miller—Treasurer. Gloria Miller has been our guild treasurer since 2011. When she retired from corporate life she chose three different organizations in which to invest volunteer time; our guild was one of them. Prior to being treasurer, she held several guild offices and served as chairperson and member of multiple committees both in and out of the guild.

Gloria didn’t start making quilts until 1969 and hasn’t stopped sewing or quilting since. The majority of her quilts have been given as gifts and are on beds throughout the USA and also a few in Europe. While Gloria admires many

styles of quilting her favorite is scrap patchwork for the richness a variety of fabrics can bring to a quilt and for the designing challenges it can present to the maker. She enjoys sharing quilting with her two sewing groups and is always stimulated by our guild speakers, workshops, and seeing the quilts made by our members.

Cathey Kennedy—Secretary. Cathey has been a crafter her entire life. After her first two sons were born, she discovered her first quilt shop and fell in love with the craft. In the 1980s, she joined QUILT (Quilters United in Learning Together) and was an active member for fifteen years. During her tenure she was on their board when they incorporated and gained their 501c3 status as a nonprofit organization. She designed their pattern of the month for nine years. She also taught quilting in local libraries and through continuing education. Most of the quilting Cathey has done over the years is by hand: piecing, appliqué, and the quilting itself. Since moving to San Francisco, where all of her adult “boys” now live, she joined our guild. To her delight, she discovered Dorcas Quilters, who meet weekly to quilt by hand, and she joined them also! Cathey is thoroughly enjoying all her new friends.

Claudia Shearer—Parliamentarian. Claudia joined the guild at the quilt show in 2013, inspired by the fantastic array of quilts on display. Mostly self-taught, Claudia started making quilts fourteen years ago. Claudia’s love of experimentation and trying new techniques has led her to making mostly improvisational, modern, and art quilts. As a member of the Sew Modern sewing circle, she enjoys sharing her passion and inspiration of quilting with a like-minded group of talented quilters—and has made some lasting friendships along the way. Claudia has volunteered her time working as a committee chair for 2015 and 2017 quilt shows and will begin her second year on the guild’s board as parliamentarian.




“shop” and they can’t wait to bring the clothes to the children.

Monday December 12, 7 P.M., the official 41st Annual Meeting of the SF chapter of EGA, is held at St. John’s UCC, 501 Laguna Honda Blvd. at Woodside Avenue, San Francisco. It’s the installation of 2017 elected officers, that include guild member Molly McLaughlin as SF’s representative among 26 chapters to the Greater Pacific Region of The Embroiderers’ Guild of America. A 7 P.M. potluck supper precedes handmade stitched unwrapped ornament exchange by whoever chooses to participate (and knows that another needle-worker can appreciate such time and talent offered this year).

Stitchers give brief explanations this night as to their ornament inspiration: techniques taught this year started with five-color shading for eye features, embroidery on wire supports for dimensional holly leaves, acrylic painting fabric backgrounds for embellishment, and crazy-patchwork techniques to produce album covers for photos or CD music as memory triggers for Alzheimer’s patients. 

Block of the Month: Strippy

A block of the month (BoM) is where a new block pattern is introduced at each guild meeting (except for November and December because of the holidays). You can make a block (or more if you wish, which will give you more chances of winning all) and bring it to the following month's guild meeting to enter it into the drawing. The winner gets all the blocks entered that month. Sometimes, if there are enough blocks entered, there may be two winners.



All the blocks for the year will be a 9" x 9" finished size (9 ½" x 9 ½" unfinished) and will be super easy to make. You may want to make one for the drawing and one for yourself; at the end of the year, you'll have enough for a quilt top—a very nice bonus.

This is a great way to take a little break from your regular day and experiment with a fun block. I look forward to seeing your BoM entries at the guild meetings! Happy quilting!

Fabric – use a variety of light color neutral prints.

Cut 6 strips — 2" x 10".

Arrange strips into a pleasing pattern. Sew strips together.

Press all seams to one side.

Trim to a 9 ½" square.




